- 'The one who strayed must be stopped. He is near, yet far from the intention of the gift'. Based on the previous statement, what was the intention of Joaquin's gift? How were the gifts used by the gifted ones throughout the story?
- Can a football game be compared to a war? Was the match between the Danville Heights Chargers and the Markley Lions announcing another kind of battle? Were any story themes or sub-themes evident in the football game, or the player interactions? Which one(s)?
- What kinds of personal challenges did the boys face?
 What characteristics did they rely upon to pull through? Can this build character in real life? In you?
 How so?
- Who are the Naculeans and where do they live? What is their purpose and how are they connected to the protagonists?
- In your opinion, does history repeat itself? Why? Did this happen in *Discovery of the Five Senses*? How?
- Who was the mysterious lady who joined the fight in Sandry Lake when the boys started losing hope? Was she related to the boys? How did this affect the remainder of the story?






- Would you like to live in Danville Heights? Why?

- The scenery in *Discovery of the Five Senses* seemed to be closely related to the emotions and lives of the citizens. Have you ever felt an emotional connection with the scenery in your area? How so?
- Were Jordan and Kinsu more in tune with nature after they inhaled the energy dust? What was their response?
- How would you feel with broken glass under your feet? Did the visual climate in Sandry Lake change your mood? How so?
- 'Huge wavy leaves danced beneath the moonlight'.

powerful and perfect

According to Druth's statement, "I'm almost there. Soon, I'll be all-powerful and perfect... for my parents," what could have caused his endless determination of becoming 'all-powerful and perfect'? Was it the love of his parents, or the lack of it, that determined Druth's actions? Was he overly emotional? Or, was it all in his mind? Explain how the impact of parents can influence decisions made by their children later in life.

What makes this book particularly fascinating is the manner in which the community where the characters exist is itself a living, conscious entity. In this respect, the book has a strong fantasy element to it. The author makes great use of backstories and subtext to lend depth, subtlety, and mystery to the unfolding of the story as it vacillates from surreality to reality. Additionally, Smith introduces poetic elements into the narrative, placing the story into a mythical context, each of the characters' actions being a response to fate as they struggle to reach a balance between the demands of normalcy and the pull of destiny. I recommend this book to readers of fantasy, mystery, and even fans of certain kinds of comic books, which explore how new powers put pressure upon those who acquire them to undergo intensive personal transformations.



Discuss the interactions between the parents/ caregivers and the boys, individually and collectively. Were the scenarios realistic according to the lives of modern teenagers? How would you have portrayed these relationships if you were the author? Keep in mind that families require trust in order to bond, and teens need room to grow, especially if they are gifted with special powers! What's your take on these dynamics?

The story brims with superhero intrigue and the true tension comes from watching the group struggle to wrestle with the "other" beyond themselves, while overcoming a battle that is closer to their hearts than they realize. Smith excellently portrays the conflict of her characters who exist in two worlds. Jordan, Rhee, Kinsu, Alex, and Chase are dynamic and multifaceted characters. Druth is equally compelling as an antagonist. Through the boys' growing realization about their role in the bigger scheme of things, Smith deftly discusses themes of responsibility, duty, loyalty, integrity, fear, courage, and triumph. Employing a fully-fleshed-out cast of intriguing characters with plenty of emotional depth, this high action-adventure skillfully explores the fight between good-versus-evil while maintaining a fast-paced clip.
